

#### Timothy J. Rutenber Memorial Scholarship for Study Abroad

Timothy J. Rutenber was the associate vice provost for international education at the University at Buffalo (UB) from 1991 to 2004. From the time he joined the university, Rutenber distinguished himself as a model of professional service whose pursuit of excellence in international education administration set an outstanding example for his colleagues at UB and the State University of New York, as well as those with whom he worked at institutions of higher education around the world.

Rutenber spent much of his early career in West Africa: first in Burkina Faso as a Peace Corps volunteer, then as part of an agricultural research project in Niger, and later as administrator of a US Agency for International Development project involving the nomadic peoples of Niger.

In recognition of Rutenber's outstanding service to the field of international education, as well as his own personal commitment to international exchange with African countries, the Office of International Education established the Timothy J. Rutenber Memorial Scholarship in 2004.

The Timothy J. Rutenber Memorial Scholarship for Study Abroad is annually awarded to one University at Buffalo undergraduate student with financial need who will participate in a study abroad program in Africa. Recipients of the Timothy J. Rutenber Memorial Scholarship for Study Abroad are required to fulfill a service requirement by assisting the UB Study Abroad office with the promotion of study abroad opportunities, particularly those in Africa. Therefore, applicants who will return to UB for at least one semester upon completion of their overseas program will be given preference for this scholarship.

#### **Eligibility requirements:**

- Applicants must be currently enrolled, full-time, matriculated University at Buffalo students in good academic standing.
- Applicants must have applied for a study abroad program in Africa. Preference will be given to students participating in a UB or SUNY program.
- Applicants must participate in the study abroad program for academic credit.
- Preference will be given to first-time study abroad participants.
- Students must have documented financial need.
- Timothy J. Rutenber Memorial Scholarship for Study Abroad recipients may not apply again.
- Recipients must fulfill a service requirement upon their return to promote study abroad at UB.

#### **Award Guidelines:**

- Applications will be reviewed by the UB Study Abroad scholarships committee.
- Finalists for the scholarship may be called for personal interviews.
- The award decisions of the committee are final and not subject to appeal.

#### **Applications:**

Pending availability of funds, applications are due **March 15** for fall, year, or summer programs and **October 15** for spring programs. A complete application includes:

- Application Form
- Typed Personal Statement and Service Requirement Statement
- One academic recommendation
- Copy of current Financial Aid award (available from Student Response Center)
